Mr. One-Eye Dies



Crescent City, May 13, 2015

Crescent City's senior peacock, Mr. One-Eye, died today as a result of injuries sustained from a hit and run incident on south Prospect St, thirty feet from the "Peacock Crossing" sign, around 10 AM on May 7th. When he was run over his wing became entangled with the vehicle, and he was dragged along the pavement until the wing dislocated. He also suffered an injury to his spine, and was unable to walk. A Crescent City employee found him, and took him to the local vet. Dr. Grossman, who does not treat birds, arranged to have him taken to the closest bird veterinarian whose office is in Interlachen. There he was treated for his wounds, and on Monday several Crescent City residents traveled to Interlachen, and brought him home hoping that familiar surroundings and home care would work a miracle.

Mr. One-Eye was born and lived his entire life in Crescent City. Somewhere during his estimated 5 years of life, he lost an eye; but this didn't cause him any problems with the ladies. When it was courting season, he was more than happy to fan his tail for the enjoyment of tourists, children, and town residents. He will be missed.

He was killed in his prime by a thoughtless and cruel driver, who, we hope, regrets his behavior. I think this was the one. As an addendum to what happened, I did not realize how many residents on the street actually like these "giant chickens". We have 2 peahens, each the mother of 4 chicks, and we are all cheering them on. With at least 1 coyote and a bobcat in the area along w. raccoons and numerous hawks, they have a tough battle to survive.
