On Saturday, January 27, 2018, we will gather beginning at 11:00 am in the Presbyterian Church Hall to socialize and share a finger food lunch. (Your favorite finger food will be most welcome.) About noon, Dr. Kathryn McLean, of the St. Augustine Presbytery will explain the Labyrinth, its purpose and place today in the spiritual life of the Church and other religions. Following her presentation, everyone is invited outside to “Walk the Labyrinth”. A canvas version of a popular shaped Labyrinth will be laid out on the grounds. The walk is a solitary journey to the center and return. There will be plenty of time for questions and perhaps a conversation on next steps for a Labyrinth in the South Putnam area.

Imagine standing in a vast open field. It is covered with a series of circles placed symmetrically inside one another, each one within the other. In the center is a circle with scalloped edges. This design can be of any one of a variety of shapes. The pathway through the circles to the center winds back and forth in an also symmetrical pattern. It looks like a maze but there are no dead ends and no forks from which to choose. The return path covers the same steps.

This is a labyrinth. The Labyrinth is primarily a Christian tradition, one of the oldest contemplative and spiritual exercises known to humankind. Those who walk the coherent circuits of the Labyrinth's path with a mindful intent, experience a peaceful present time in a special space.





Crescent City Arbor Day and Native Tree Giveaway

Location: Fletcher Park (1124 Summit St)

Date and Time: Tuesday, January 16th at 9:00am

The City will be planting a 30 gallon tree at the park. The Waccasassa Forestry Center of the Florida Forest Service will give away native trees at the event. Forester Conrad Wysocki will also demonstrate tree planting techniques during the event. The trees they will give away will consist of the following species:

- ◆ American Hornbeam (*Carpinus caroliniana*)
- ◆ Bald Cypress (*Taxodium distichum*)
- ◆ Green Ash (*Fraxinus pennsylvanica*)
- ◆ Live Oak (*Quercus virginiana*)
- ◆ Red Buckeye (*Aesculus pavia*)
- ◆ Red Cedar (*Juniperus virginiana*)
- ◆ Sassafras (*Sassafras albidum*)
- ◆ Swamp Bay (*Persea palustris*)
